NARRATOR:

READING FROM THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW, CHAPTER 21:1-11

*As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives,
Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them,
“Go to the village ahead of you,
and at once you will find a donkey tied there,
with her colt by her.*

*Untie them and bring them to me.
If anyone says anything to you,
say that the Lord needs them,
and he will send them right away.”*

This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet [Zechariah]:

*Say to [the] Daughter [of] Zion,
‘See, your king comes to you,
gentle and riding on a donkey,
and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.’*

The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them.

*They brought the donkey and the colt
and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on.
A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road,
while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road.*

*The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted,
“Hosanna to the Son of David!”
“Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!”
“Hosanna in the highest heaven!”*

*When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, “Who is this?”
The crowds answered, “This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee.”*

Lamb OF CALVARY

The Passover Feast commemorated Israel's miraculous deliverance from the bondage of slavery in Egypt.

God had heard his people's cry for help,
and had sent a series of terrible plagues
to demonstrate his power over the false gods
of the most powerful nation on earth.

The Lord told Moses to command every Jewish family to kill a spotless lamb
and to brush its blood on the top and sides of the doorposts of their homes.
Then they were to cook and eat the lamb in remembrance of that night.

Those families would be spared the death of their firstborn
when the angel of death passed over the land.

Pharaoh finally relented, and the children of Israel were freed.

Jesus took the key elements of that meal
--the unleavened bread and the wine---
and had the audacity to say that he was the Lamb
whose blood would be shed to free us from the bondage of sin.

Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.
There was a violent earthquake,
for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and,

His appearance was like lightning,
and his clothes were white as snow.
The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men.
The angel said to the women,
"Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified.
He is not here; he has risen, just as he said.


